***SHIP:** The Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) is a FREE statewide health insurance counseling service for Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers. SHIP is sponsored by the Illinois Division of Insurance. SHIP counselors are trained by the Illinois Division of Insurance to educate consumers and answer questions about Medicare, Medicare Supplement, long term care insurance, Medicare HMOs, private fee-for-service and other health insurance, organize and assist in filing Medicare and Medicare Supplement claims, and analyze Medicare Supplement and long term care policies.
