Holiday Collection Schedules

Memorial Day, Monday, May 25

No refuse, yard waste and recycling collections will occur on Monday, May 25 due to the holiday. All collections will occur one day later during that week.

Independence Day holiday, Friday, July 3

Recycling Center, 2222 Oakton Street, will be closed. Friday condo collections will occur on Thursday, July 2.



Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 7

No refuse/recycling/yard waste collected on Monday, Sept. 7. All collections will occur one day later this week.

Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, Nov. 26

No refuse, yard waste, recycling collections on Thursday. Thursday's collections and Friday's condo collections will occur on Saturday, Nov. 28.

Note: The Recycling Center, 2222 Oakton Street, will be closed on Friday, Nov. 27.

Christmas Eve, Thursday, Dec. 24

No refuse/recycling collections on Thursday. Thursday's collection will be picked up on Saturday, Dec. 26.

New Year's Day, Friday, Jan. 1, 2010
Friday's condo collections will occur on Saturday, Jan. 2.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday, Monday, Jan. 18, 2010

No refuse/recycling collections scheduled on Monday. All pickups are one day later this week.

More Capacity + More Convenience = More Recycling



The residents on Tuesday's refuse/recycling collection day will be the first to trade in their 18-gallon recycling bins for either 65- or 95-gallon wheeled recycling carts. Residents may request the size cart they would like to receive by e-mailing publicworks@cityofevanston.org or by calling Streets and Sanitation at (847) 866-2940. If no selection is made, a 65-gallon cart will be provided. There are a limited number of 35-gallon recycling carts that are available to seniors and residents with special needs; these may be requested in the same manner as the other carts.

Sanitation employees will deliver carts and recycling information packets on Saturdays in April. Staff will be available to answer any of your recycling questions. The City requests that you turn in your old 18-gallon bins for recycling or reuse.

Funding for this program was subsidized through a grant received from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO). The City has budgeted for additional funding to continue the cart transition to the other collection routes. The City anticipates converting Wednesday's and Thursday's routes later in 2009; Monday's route will be transitioned in early 2010. The gap between route deliveries will allow City staff to focus their recycling education efforts on a smaller group. Sanitation staff will conduct periodic waste demonstrations to show residents how easy it is to recycle!

General guidelines for refuse disposal in Evanston

The City of Evanston breaks down your "trash" into five categories:

- * Household waste
- * Recycling
- * Special pick-ups
- * Yard waste
- * Hazardous waste



Specific procedures dealing with most of these categories are detailed in this newsletter. Here are some general "rules of thumb" to keep in mind for quick, weekly pick-ups that keep our environment safe:

- ❖ It is illegal to mix yard waste and household waste. The Sanitation Division will not collect either until separated.
- ❖ Containers other than the waste carts issued by the City will not be handled by Sanitation Crews.
- ❖ No construction materials will be picked up. Contractors are responsible for dis-

posing of this material from your property. Failure to dispose of these building materials will result in a citation. If Sanitation must ultimately remove the materials, a collection fee will be assessed to your water bill.

- ❖ Garbage must be placed on the curb or alley line by 7 a.m.; it will not be collected from private property.
- ❖ Due to landfill policies, the Sanitation Division must abide by the following rules:
 - ✓ No car parts
 - ✓ No hazardous material: gas, oil, medical waste, etc.
 - ✓ Tires, call for free pick-up.
- ❖ All refuse must be bagged, contained or bundled and placed completely inside the garbage cart with the lid closed to prevent blowing or scattering.

❖ The Sanitation Division provides one functional refuse cart at no charge and will provide additional refuse carts for \$75 each. Additional carts can be ordered using a form on the City's Web site or by calling the City Collector's Office at (847) 866-2926. Residents with extra carts will be assessed a service charge of \$2.50 per month, per cart, for emptying the additional containers. This charge will be added to your water bill.

Remember:

Community members found to be in violation of Sanitation Ordinances are subject to fines of \$25-\$500 per day.

❖ An orange sticker placed on your materials for pick-up means the collection did not meet certain standards. Please take a moment to read the sticker and abide by the rules. Compliance is necessary to avoid being cited for a violation.

- steel (tin) cans & bi-metal cans
- aerosol cans (empty)
- aluminum beverage & pet food cans
- aluminum foil & foil pans & containers

PLASTIC

- containers, bottles & lids labeled #1, #2, #3, #4 & #5

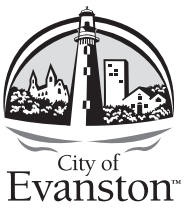

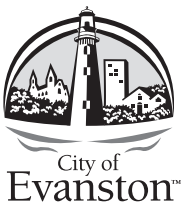

Commercial Waste Franchise

The City of Evanston commenced a Municipal Solid Waste Franchise. Groot Industries was awarded the hauling contract and began transitioning accounts in November 2008. All accounts were transitioned over a four-month period ending March 1, 2009. The program provides for a single hauler to collect and dispose of solid waste from all businesses, commercial properties and larger residential developments. This will allow the City to gain a more accurate count of the waste it generates, reduce pollution and reduce the cost of waste removal for most businesses.

Business Recycling

As a part of the Solid Waste Franchise, all businesses and residential multi-family properties are eligible to receive one 95-gallon recycling container (and once-weekly service) free of charge. Carts will automatically be delivered to residential multi-family properties; business and commercial properties must request a container from Groot.

If one 95-gallon recycling cart is not enough, you may request a larger container or more frequent collection for additional fees. You also may request a free waste assessment, which will determine the types of waste your company produces and how large your recycling and waste containers should be to accommodate your needs. Recycling service through the Solid Waste Franchise does not cost more than waste disposal and in many cases is less expensive.

Five Reasons to Recycle at Home and at Work

- 1** Recycling is good for Evanston. Evanston residents diverted 5% more waste in 2007 than in 2006. When Evanston residents recycle, City revenues go up and the City spends less on landfill fees. It's good for business because American companies rely on recycling programs to provide the raw materials they need to make new products.
- 2** Recycling reduces waste. Illinois residents throw away 5½ pounds of garbage every day. By recycling more, Evanston residents can reduce the need for additional garbage containers, and save money too. By recycling more, Evanston businesses can reduce the need for additional garbage containers, and save some money too.
- 3** Recycling is good for the environment. Recycling uses fewer natural resources, reducing the need to impact natural areas essential to wildlife.
- 4** Recycling preserves landfill space. There are no more landfills left in Northern Illinois.
- 5** Recycling prevents climate change. In 2005, recycling reduced Evanston's greenhouse gas emissions by 23,482 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent.



Materials for bulk pick-up must be less than six cubic yards per household and must be placed out in an orderly fashion, i.e., bagged, contained or bundled, with no loose garbage.

Special Pick-Ups Require Fee

The City of Evanston charges a fee for special pick-ups, which are defined as refuse exceeding the capacity of your garbage cart plus one additional bag.

For special pick-ups, a fee of \$25 is charged for the first three cubic yards of refuse. For each additional three cubic yards of refuse, a fee of \$10 will be charged. The charge will be placed on your water bill for payment at a later date.

“Specials” are required after a move-out or move-in, a major clean-up effort, or when you want to dispose of a large piece of furniture.

Please call the Streets & Sanitation Division at (847) 866-2940 to request a special pick-up. Within 48 hours, a sanitation crew will perform the special pickup and a fee will be assessed.

2009 Bulk Trash Pick-Up Days

The Streets & Sanitation Division will offer the free removal of six cubic yards of bulk garbage twice this year.

Bulk trash must meet these guidelines:

- ❖ Items must be less than six cubic yards per household. Six cubic yards is roughly equivalent to two couches, four chairs, one mattress and box-spring, **or** 25 medium garbage bags. Quantities that exceed six cubic yards will be tagged as special pick-ups and a fee will be assessed.
- ❖ Items must be placed out in an orderly fashion, i.e., bagged, contained or bundled, no loose garbage.
- ❖ Absolutely no hazardous materials will be collected, including batteries, gas, oil, asbestos, medical waste, paint, etc.
- ❖ Glass should be broken up and boxed; tape the box and label it as glass.
- ❖ Bulk trash must be placed out by 7 a.m. on the alley line or parkway. Crews will not remove items from private property nor return for late set outs.
- ❖ Absolutely no construction materials will be picked up.
- ❖ No tires or appliances will be collected.
- ❖ Crews will only remove bulk items; no garbage carts will be emptied.

If crews are unable to complete routes on Fridays, collections will continue on Saturdays.

Residents with larger debris removal needs must call (847) 866-2940 to request a special pick-up, or contact SWANCC at (847) 390-6820 to request a dumpster. Both of these alternatives involve a charge.

Yard waste season begins April 6

The City's weekly yard waste pickup begins on Monday, April 6 and continues on your regular refuse/recycling collection day through Thursday, Dec. 3.



To ensure compliance with state laws, yard waste must be collected separately from the rest of the household waste, and residents are required to use any of these three options for disposal of yard waste:

- ❖ Place yard waste in paper yard waste bags, such as 30-gallon kraft paper lawn waste bags, which are available in packages at local stores. *Plastic bags will not be collected.*
- ❖ Compost and mulch to recycle the earth's nutrients. For further information, call the

Ecology Center, (847) 448-8256.

- ❖ Fill City of Evanston 95-gallon yard waste carts, which are available for purchase. These reusable carts do not require the use of bags.
- ❖ Brush must be bundled and no longer than four feet in length and four inches in diameter.

To order a yard waste cart, complete the form on the City's Web site at www.cityofevanston.org, and return it with your payment to the City Collector. The City will perform minor repairs to yard waste carts at no charge.

Leaf blower ban

The City of Evanston's Ordinance 70-0-96 regulates the use of backpack-mounted or hand-held gasoline-powered leaf blower types of machines. Use of these machines is prohibited during parts of the year.

Backpack-mounted and hand-held gasoline-powered leaf blower types of machines are banned May 15 through Sept. 30 and Dec. 15 through March 30.

However, these types of machines **are permitted** March 31 through May 14 and Oct. 1 through Dec. 14 during the following hours: Monday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
