	Program serves a significant portion of Evanston residents or a substantial number of Evanston residents.	Residents comprise 50% or more of total population served OR a significant number of residents are enrolled in case management services (ex: 250+ people served). Number of residents served is reasonable based on total population served.	
	City funding would expand capacity to serve new Evanston participants OR a loss of funding would significantly reduce the number of Evanston residents enrolled in case management services.	Program enrolls (anticipates enrolling) new residents; application includes projections of residents to receive services, the number of residents served in prior year, and waitlist numbers, and additional staff capacity as needed.	
	Program provides outreach to Evanston residents AND accepts referrals from community partners.	Program provides outreach to targeted Evanston populations AND accepts referrals from community partners working with target populations.	
	Program provides services in ways that demonstrate cultural humility.	Application describes cultural competency practices/training opportunities; staff demographics reflect population served, bilingual staff or language translation services available/offered, front-line staff influence or impact service provision, etc.

Best Practices - Case Management	Case managers follow best practices.	Best practices, including reasonable caseloads, staff training, and use of client-centered methodology (use of trauma informed care, strengths-based assessment, etc.), are defined, documented, and followed.	
	Service Plans are client-centered and have specific goals/measures/assessments; Service Plans are updated regularly.	Policies/procedures for creating & tracking outcomes. Case managers meet regularly/consistently with participants	
	Service Plans document participant engagement and referral/benefits enrollment process.	Application describes method of tracking participant engagement and referrals. Program is able to report number of successful referrals provided to residents in prior years. Sample/redacted Service Plan and intake forms provided.	
	Case management services <b>measurably reduce poverty</b> by making appropriate referrals and successfully connecting residents to/enrolling residents in resources.	Application documents poverty reduction through successful community connections and benefits enrollment. Referral process is described and typical referrals are listed. Case Managers are able to connect residents to services that measurably reduce poverty (ex. SNAP, Medicaid, LIHEAP, SSI/SSDI, HeadStart/Early HeadStart, Dist 65/202 services, housing support, etc.).	
	Program works collaboratively with community partners to benefit Evanston residents.	Program accepts referrals from other agencies, successfully enrolls residents in services with other agencies as needed, and has documented MOUs	
	Program has a system for receiving participant feedback and/or incorporates the knowledge, perspective, and experiences of people who have used or benefited from services.	Program surveys participants to get feedback, regularly receives information from people with lived experience, has a representative advisory board, and a grievance policy.	
	Services are easily accessible to Evanston residents.	Agency is located close to public transportation OR case management services are provided at identified community locations or some other way that is accessible to Evanston residents.
