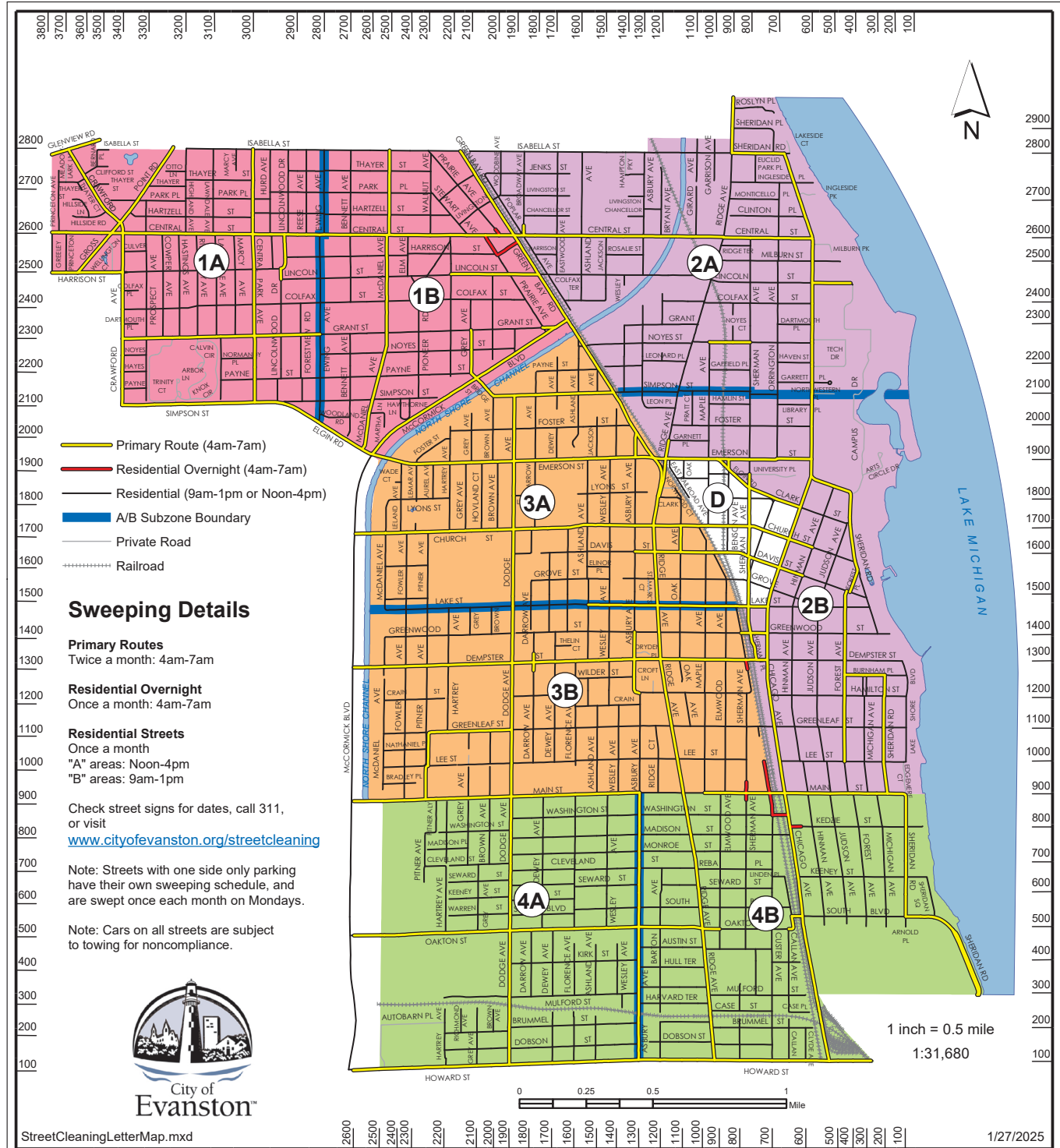
Map 1. Two-sided Street Cleaning Schedule March 1–December 15

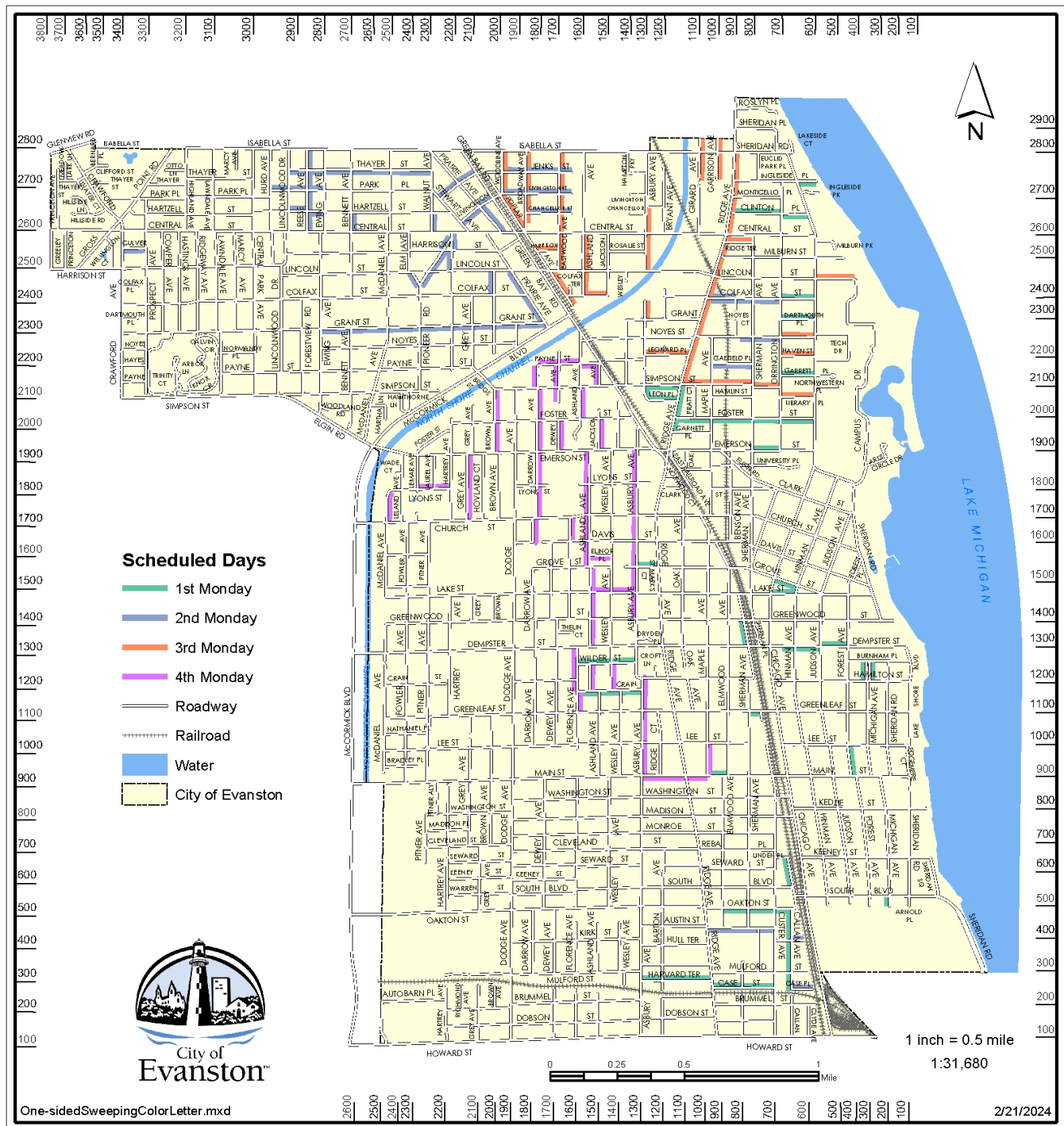

Refuse & Recycling Services

Residential Service

Households have three options for refuse cart sizes: 95-gallon, 65-gallon, and 35-gallon.



Cart Pricing

Beginning in May, the following rates will take effect. All services, including recycling (which is built into refuse cart prices), are billed on a household's bi-monthly water bill.

95-gal Refuse Cart: \$53.90 every two months (\$26.95/month)

65-gal Refuse Cart: \$28.00 every two months (\$14/month)

35-gal Refuse Cart: \$23.86 every two months (\$11.93/month)

Additional Containers: Residents can request additional food and yard waste carts and will be charged \$11.93 per month/cart. Contact the 311 to request additional carts.

Condo Service

Refuse and recycling services are available for condo buildings with six or more units, provided they have 75% owner-occupancy rate and are registered with the City. The monthly fee is \$11.56 per unit, covering both refuse and recycling, and may appear on owner bi-monthly City water bill or be billed to the condo association.

- Refuse is collected twice a week by the City's contracted vendor, who also provides buildings with dumpsters and/or 95-gallon containers.
- Weekly recycling collection is provided on Fridays by the City, which provides 95-gallon carts or dumpsters.

Collection Guidelines

- Material must be at the curb or alley by 7 a.m.
- Only designated City or contracted vendor containers will be serviced.
- All waste must be bagged, contained, or bundled. Carts and dumpster lids should be able to close.
- Prohibited items include car parts, tires, electronics, construction materials, gas, oil, medical waste, and hazardous materials.
- Carts (refuse, recycling, food and yard waste) must not exceed 50 lbs. Heavier carts may not be serviced.

Special Pickup/Bulk

The City has ended its pre-scheduled spring and fall bulk pickup days. Beginning April 1, residents can request individual bulk or special waste pickups by contacting the 311 Center. To support on-demand pickups, a \$1 per-unit, per-month fee will be added to all residential accounts.

1-5 Unit Properties: 3 cubic yards will be picked up per pickup request; a total of 12 cubic yards will be picked up in the calendar year

6-20 Unit Properties: 6 cubic yards will be picked up per pickup request; a total of 30 cubic yards will be picked up for the entire calendar year

21+ Unit Properties: 6 cubic yards will be picked up per pickup request; a total of 75 cubic yards will be picked up for the entire calendar year

Other Waste Services

Food and Yard Waste Schedule

This service is now offered year-round, with weekly collection for eligible properties from April through November and every-other-week collection from December through March. Service days will depend on the residential schedule.

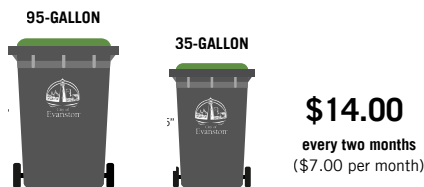

Food and Yard Waste Carts & Pricing

This service is available to residential and condo customers. The City now has two food and yard waste cart size options: 95-gallon and 35-gallon. Residential customers not already using a cart will be provided a 35-gallon cart automatically by the end of March. Condo customers must contact the 311 Center to utilize this service.

Cart Pricing

Food and Yard Waste cart service fees will now appear on the water bill as a year-round charge of \$7 per month, billed as \$14 per cycle.



Additional Containers: Contact the 311 Center to request additional food & yard waste carts for \$11.93 per cart per month.

Yard Waste Stickers

Yard waste stickers will now be issued by the City's refuse collection service vendor, LRS. Previously purchased City-branded stickers will be accepted through November 1, 2026. Households can purchase stickers at \$2.50 a piece for Kraft paper bags or bundles at the following locations:

Food Waste Storage Tips

- Gather food scraps in a counter-top bin in the kitchen, and consider lining the bottom with a paper towel to keep it cleaner
- Consider storing food scraps in the freezer to minimize odors or mess until the next service day.
- Dispose of food scraps in your carts the night before service.
- Layer food scraps and yard waste in your bin to help control odors
- Regularly rinse containers (cart or bin) to keep item clean.

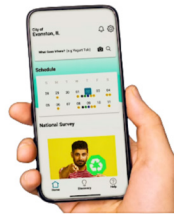

Save the Dates

Evanston Recycles Event - June 27

Each year in the summer, Evanston holds a one day "drive-in, drop-off" at Evanston Township High School where community members can recycle electronics, confidential documents, and medications.

It's The Great Pumpkin Compost - November 7

This free "drive-up, drop-off" event provides community members without a food and yard waste cart an opportunity to compost their pumpkins. Plain, clean pumpkins of any size will be accepted, as well as pumpkins painted with acrylic paint.

Holiday Tree Recycling

The City has partnered with LRS to provide holiday tree collection during the first two full weeks of January each year, weather permitting. Trees will be collected on residents' regular refuse and recycling pickup day.

Tree Collection Guidelines

- All trees should be placed on the parkway
- No trees placed in the alley or private property
- Do not place trees in plastic bags
- Remove all lights and decorations from trees

Water and Sewer

Reduced Water and Sewer Rate

Did you know that you may qualify for a reduced water and sewer bill? As part of the City's efforts to ensure that everyone has access to affordable, high-quality drinking water, all Evanston community members who qualify for the Evanston Benefit Card can participate in this program. Reducing Pollutants

Consumer Confidence Report

Every year by July 1, all drinking water providers are required by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to share a water quality report with residents, known as the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR). The Evanston Water Utility is proud to share that this year's CCR confirms our drinking water met or exceeded all federal drinking water standards—reflecting our ongoing commitment to providing safe, high-quality water to the community. Alley Maintenance

Each year, starting in the spring, Evanston's more than 300 unpaved alleys are periodically graded by the City. This is done to eliminate potholes and ruts caused by vehicles, weather and other factors. The process improves travel and reduces puddling.
