



Zombie Scramble FAQ's

***You MUST wear your 2018 Zombie Scramble T-shirt to gain admission to the starting line. For those who registered after the deadline, and therefore are not guaranteed a T-shirt you will either receive a T-shirt (if available) at check-in or a hand stamp that will act as your admission.**

1. What do I do if I lose all of my lives?

Each participant will receive two "lives" represented as flags attached to a belt you will wear around your waist. Your job is to protect your "lives" from the zombies. If you happen to lose your two "lives" you will be infected, but still finish the race!!

2. How do I get a raffle ticket and what do I do with it? When will I know if I win?

Every registered person who finishes the scramble with lives still intact will receive a raffle ticket. Fill out your ticket and drop it in the bucket of the prize you'd like to win! (The prize table will be in the hallway of the Ecology Center). The drawing will take place and winners will be notified on Monday, October 22nd.

3. What should I do with my belt and flags after the race?

Please turn your flags and belts into the finish line staff after completing the race.

4. Where do I go while my child participates in the event?

Parents and guardians are welcome to wait in the back of the Ecology Center by the fire pit. There is also an area by the starting line for you to watch their start.

5. Are there any other activities?

There will be some activities available inside and outside the Ecology Center.

6. I lost a personal item on the course, who should I contact?

Find a staff member in a Blue shirt and give them as much information as possible. If we are unable to find the item we will take down your information and contact you if the item is found.

7. What if I get injured during the scramble?

We will have staff certified in First-Aid on site that will be mobile. Please notify or have someone in the group notify a staff member and they will come to you.

8. Will there be somewhere to rest or to take a break while on the course?

There will be several safe zones throughout the course where zombies will not be present. Also, at each challenge station there will be water stations and a chance to catch your breath.

9. What are the Challenge Stations and where will they be?

There will be 2 challenge stations that will be clearly marked throughout the course. We do hope that everybody will attempt the challenges, but it is not required. Please note that both of the stations require participants to take off their shoes (there will be tarps laid out on the ground for you to walk on).

10. What do I do if I or someone in my group gets scared?

Our zombies are instructed to break character if a participant indicates to them they are scared. Simple ask the zombies to break character, and if needed they can escort you to the next course marshal. The course marshal will have a radio and, if necessary, we can send staff to pick you up.

11. Do we need to bring anything for the scramble?

Participants should bring a flashlight to use on the course (please DO NOT shine these lights into the zombie's eyes). Participants should also turn in the signed liability waiver by Friday, October 19 (the waiver is available [here](#)). For participants under the age of 17, the waiver must be signed by a guardian. 12. I'm a parent of a participant, where can I wait?

We welcome parents of participants to wait behind the Ecology Center by the bond fire. The finish line is in this area. It should take your child approximately 30-45 minutes to go through the course (it is just under 2-miles, so some participants may finish faster).
