



### **3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Coloring Contest**

The City of Evanston is hosting an art contest as part of National Drinking Water Week 2019 (#NDWW) (May 5 – 11). The purpose of NDWW is to celebrate water by recognizing the essential role it plays in our daily lives. The City will host the art contest for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students in Evanston schools/community organizations with the goal of education and promotion around drinking water.

#### Art Contest Details:

- Submissions should fit onto an 8.5x11 piece of paper or smaller and can include any medium (paint, crayons, colored pencils, collage, etc).
- Students' artwork should help celebrate the theme, "Protect the Source."
- **Winners will be selected via online voting March 22 to April 5** and their entries will be featured on the City's website.
- Winners will be announced at the Administration & Public Works Committee meeting of the Evanston City Council. Those selected will be invited to attend the presentation of the awards.
- Top entries will be displayed at the Evanston Main Library during National Drinking Water Week.
- The overall winners will be presented with a plaque and will have their artwork featured on the homepage of the City of Evanston website. Each of the three winners will receive a four-pack of Evanston Beach Tokens for the 2019 summer.
- City of Evanston staff from the Water Production Bureau will be available to make presentations on drinking water and the contest to schools/classes who are interested.

#### **Deadline for submission: Monday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 4pm**

Submit artwork to the Evanston Water Production Bureau, 555 Lincoln Street, Evanston, IL 60201. Artwork can be mailed or dropped off Monday – Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Artists must be in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Please include students' full name, school, class room number and teacher's name on the back of artwork.
