PROJECT OVERVIEW

The City of Evanston is performing a planning study for improving the streetscape and safety of Main Street between Maple Road and Hinman Avenue. Main Street is a key east-west collector on the South Side of the city connecting people to businesses, public transportation, school, and entertainment.

This corridor improvement project will improve the roadway and beautify the corridor for local businesses and residents while promoting economic growth to the south side of Evanston.

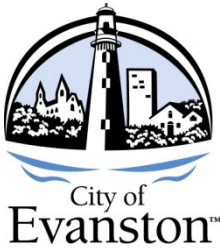
The City of Evanston and a team of consultants have gathered and analyzed project data as well as gathered stakeholder feedback and developed alternative solutions.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

- Phase I (2019)
 - Analyze Current and Future Conditions
 - Select a Preferred Improvement Plan
 - Submit Project Development Report
 - Obtain Design Approval from IDOT
 - Submit ITEP Funding Application
- Phase II (12 to 18 months)
 - Finalize Design/Prepare Contract Plans
 - Negotiate Property Agreements
 - Advertise for Construction
- Phase III (1 year)
 - Construction
